Neighborhood Service Council is in the business of expanding kids' horizons and making Richardson and North Dallas a better place to live. We do it because we love our community and because we want a great future for our children.

In the years since 1989, when NSC first opened its doors, we have worked together to transform our neighborhood. Together, we are helping at-risk children and youth grow into responsible citizens in a safe environment. This is no small feat with an escalating number of low-income families in need of access to free and low cost programs and services.

With mounting demands for NSC services, we endured many challenges. However, through the dedication of our volunteers, talented staff and the generous support of so many caring community members, we reached out and continued to make a difference by:

- Successfully implementing the Tweens program, which provides support and education for fifth and sixth grade girls from single-parent homes during a time in their lives when they need it most. In this inaugural year of the program, more than 50 girls participated.

- Reorganizing the NSC board, staff and program volunteers to better serve the organization
- Negotiating the relocation of our programs in order to serve more students

It is with mixed emotion that I step down from my position as NSC President and turn over the reins to the experienced and extremely capable hands of L.L. Cotter, long-time NSC friend, board member and volunteer. In the three years that I have served as President, I have seen this organization through many changes and look forward to the direction and renewed vigor L.L. brings.

Neighborhood Service Council (NSC) is focused on improving the quality of life for low-income, at-risk children and impoverished adults in North Dallas and Richardson by offering free after school, summer, and evening fun as well as informal education programs.

NSC's programs are proactive, results-oriented, and community-centered, designed to empower families to become productive and contributing members of the community.

Emergency Intervention Efforts:

- Provided school supplies and uniforms for over 100 students enrolled in schools in our area.
- Actively recruited students for NSC's free after-school and summer programs

Year-Round Day Camp:

- Adventure Time provided after-school activities during the school year, and served 95 students in 2007.
- My Time provided day-long activities for teens during the summer and served 30 students last year.

NSC's Annual Earth Day Celebration:

- More than 2,000 area students learned math, science, and ecology and took part in career building projects in personal and practical ways.

NSC Parenting Seminars:

- Helped over 300 families learn parenting skills, share a meal and understand a way to better utilize area resources to become independent citizens.

Cleanup of Cottonwood Park Dallas :

- Related advocacy efforts brought new opportunities for camps, recreational and educational programs as well as family outings in 2007 and for years to come.
- Joined Texas Instruments, the City of Dallas, and other community partners for annual cleanup of Cottonwood Park, which serves the NSC community.

Health Resources:

Tweens:

- Created as a result of 2006 Dallas Woman's Foundation grant for after-school program serving K-6 grade RISD girls who live with single mothers.

- Included components for girls, moms, and alternative NSC after-school care for younger siblings.
- Seventy seven previously un-served 5th & 6th grade girls benefited from Tweens

- Published "*Summary of Free and Low Cost Programs For 2007*" providing information on over 30 North Dallas/Richardson Programs and Services.

NSC's programs are designed to help children and youth grow into responsible citizens in a safe neighborhood, and provide families with opportunities to learn and achieve a better quality of life. NSC operates with a small paid staff and owns one 15-passenger van. The rest of the work—tutoring, care and operation of the van, event co-sponsoring, and many other activities necessary for assisting NSC children, youth, and adults—is done by more than 400 dedicated volunteers and collaborators.
